STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

The Equestrian Canada Federation (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. The EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, Coaches, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care
 professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, com fort, sanitation
 and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- Requiring owners, Coaches and exhibitor s to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work with in
 industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- · Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

The Show Committee reserves the right to add, amend or delete any point not covered by the rules & to correct any error or make any necessary changes in the Prize List or Program. The Show Committee reserves the right to add classes or make necessary changes to tentative schedule but will exercise this with ample notice given to exhibitors affected by changes.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- This show is conducted in accordance with the Rules of EC and AHA. Each participant in this show is responsible for knowledge of the rules and is subject to these rules. Any changes or corrections will automatically become part of this Prize List. Questions that arise that are not covered by either AHA or EC rulebooks will be decided by the Show Committee and their decisions will be final.
- Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and the horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all the rules of EC and any additional rules set by competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rule imposed by the competition.
- Per Article A602.2, Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with EC Rule Book.
- Exhibitors must ascertain when their stock will be judged. Calling of classes is a courtesy only. Exhibitors failing check-in at the hitching ring may have their animals excluded from their class.
- Gate holds will be allowed with the discretion of the Show Committee and must be requested through the Hitching Ring personnel and/or Show Office well before the class (preferably before the session starts). The show Committee will make every effort to accommodate tack changes: time restriction will be 3 minute gate hold and a 2 minute gate. Tack changes to be completed in the hitching ring area.

SAFETY REGULATION: EC Article A905.2

(1) At all times, persons mounted or carriage driving at an EC Sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear as described below.

Exceptions: See discipline or breed sport rules:

- a) Section B American Saddlebred: B302.2, B405.2, B902
- b) Section B Arabian: B1306.7
- c) Section B Morgan: B5208.2, B5502.2, B5602.2, B5803.1(b), B5903.1-2, B6003, 5702.2, B6103.4, B6401.5, B6409.1, B6503
- (2) Protective Headgear must be:
 - a) Approved by an accredited certification organization. See glossary - Headgear Standards;
 - b) Properly fitted; and
 - c) Securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.
- (3) Any competitor may wear approved protective headgear in any division or class without penalty from the Judge.
- (4) EC makes no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any approved protective headgear. EC cautions riders and drivers that serious injury or death may result

despite wearing such headgear, as all equestrian sports involve inherent risk, and no protective headgear can protect against all foreseeable injury.

- (5) General Performance Class- Those riders normally exempt from wearing helmet's are not required to wear helmets.
- 7. As per EC ARTICLE A519: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule will be asked to leave the event site by Competition Management.

The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. Competition management requires supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements.

If administered by a veterinarian, the veterinarian will provide documentation to the Person Responsible. If the veterinarian did not administer the vaccine, the Person Responsible will provide:

- -the horse's name
- -a copy of the vaccine purchase receipt
- -name of the vaccine with serial number and expiration date
- -the date administered
- a signature confirming all information is true and correct
- 8. Any classes may be cancelled or combined at the discretion of the show committee. Entrants shall be notified. All changes will be posted at the show office. Additions to class list may be considered by the Show Committee.
- 9. All dogs must be kept on a leash on the show grounds. Dogs are NOT allowed in the Ag-Events Center or barn at any time.
- 10. Bikes/Scooters/Skate Boards are NOT to be ridden in the Barn or area between the Barn and Arena.
- 11. **TAKE NOTICE:** You are not allowed to tie to the exterior of the stalls or cross-tie horses in the alleyway. If you tie to the exterior of the stalls or cross-tie a horse in the alley-way, you will not be covered by insurance, and you assume all risks and liabilities.
- 12. There is to be no riding your horses into or out of the barn, due to insurance policy regulations.
- 13. Exhibitors are asked to ensure that adequate and safe access be maintained throughout all alley ways of the barn at all times. FIRE LANES MUST BE KEPT CLEAR.
- 14. EC Coach Status 2024 Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or

specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance.

Coaches attending EC sanctioned events require Licensed Coach Status. Any listed coach who do not hold coach status must purchase a Temporary Coach status directly from EC, (competitions no longer need to administer) Coaches can log into their MyEC to select the event they will be attending and purchase the temporary status on line.

15. Spring Fling, it's exhibitors and spectators are to follow EC and AHA code of conduct and ethics. You can visit www.equestrian.ca or AHA at www.arabianhorse.org Chapter 3 in the handbook for detailed information. If you need assistance you can reach out to the Steward, Show Manger, or Show Secretary.

ACCIDENTS & RETURN TO PLAY

- 1. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign) at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at the event location.
- 2. In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, (not limited to a direct blow to the head or loss of consciousness), the competitor must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite, through the EC Accident Injury Report Form before continuing. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. If the competitor refuses to be evaluated, he/she is disqualified from the event.
- 3. If the qualified medical personnel suspect's a concussion (regardless of symptoms displayed) or believes that the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor is suspended from competition until medically released, as outlined in paragraph 6 below.
- 4. In the case of the preceding paragraphs, an EC Accident/Injury Report Form must be completed by either the attending Steward, Technical Delegate or the attending qualified medical personnel onsite and submitted to EC within 24 hours of the occurrence. It is the Steward's/Technical Delegate's responsibility to ensure forms are complete and submitted on time.
- 5. Any competitor suspended from competing further at the event on the basis of any of the preceding paragraphs will be placed on a medical suspension list, managed by EC, until medically released as in the process described in paragraph 6.
- 6. In the event a competitor is determined ineligible to compete per one of the above conditions, the competitor must submit the EC Return to Play Form to EC, completed by a licensed physician. The EC Return to Play Form will be processed by EC within two business days, at which point the competitor will be removed from the EC Medical Suspension list and may return to regular competition. If the competitor wishes to compete after being medically released by a physician but before the EC processing period of the form, the competitor must also submit a copy of the EC Return to Play

Form to the show secretary. In this case the competitor is competing at their own risk and may be pursuant to fines and penalties if the form is found to be incomplete in any way.

7. No competitor shall compete in an EC sanctioned event while on the EC Medical Suspension List. It is the responsibility of the competitor to refrain from competition and the competition organiser may refuse entry to anyone currently on the EC Medical Suspension List.

8. These rules also apply to EC sanctioned competitors competing in FEI and USEF competitions.

MEMBERSHIP AND REGISTRATION

- 1. Horses entering any classes (except those listed as All Breeds) must be registered with the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry (CAHR), The Arabian Horse Registry of America or the AHA: the Canadian Morgan Horse Association (CMHA): the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Canada (ASHAC); or any other duly recognized registry if the horse is owned by a citizen of a foreign county. For greater clarity, an American Saddlebred or Morgan owned by an American citizen may be entered with a name and registration number from the American Saddlebred Horse Association, Inc. or the American Morgan Horse Association. Horses must be entered under their full registered name with their registration number, or if an age specified by breed rules, as eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the name(s) of the owner or lessee of the record with the breed association. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with the entry form at the time the entry is made.
- 2. Each competitor (this includes at least one recorded owner and all Coaches, drivers, riders, halter handlers, coaches and the person(s) signing the entry form) in an Arabian Horse Association recognized Arabian Division, at the time of entry into a competition, must submit a copy of a valid AHA membership/competition card, join AHA or pay an AHA single event membership fee per competitor.

When an agent signs for the owner at an AHA recognized competition, both the owner and agent must be members of AHA or pay the AHA single event membership.

Single event membership is not acceptable at AHA Regional or National competitions.

A single event membership can be purchased for the show through the show office for 50 CAD (35.00 USD + 15.00 exchange).

Exhibitors in Walk-Trot/Jog classes are exempt from AHA membership requirements at qualifying competitions but must have an AHA membership with competition cards at AHA Regional and National competitions.

Exhibitors in lead line classes or parents/guardians signing for minors are exempt from AHA membership requirements. (BOD 5/12)

3. Alberta residents who are owners and/or exhibitors of American Saddlebreds showing at the Spring Fling are required to hold a current year membership with the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Alberta (ASHA of Alberta)

and show proof of membership upon entering. See www.saddlebredsofalberta.com for the current membership form.

- 4. All Canadian resident owners and Coaches of Canadian registered American Saddlebreds must be current members of the American Saddlebred Horse Association of Canada. Visit www.clrc.ca to obtain membership information for ASHA of Canada. Owners and Coaches of American Saddlebreds from a foreign country must be current members of the American Saddlebred Horse Association, Inc. Visit www.saddlebred.com to obtain membership.
- 5. All owners of registered Morgan horses must be current members of the Canadian Morgan Horse Association.
- 6. All owners, drivers, riders, lessees, agents or Coaches must hold an EC Competitive License (Bronze for the 2024 Spring Fling). U.S. citizens with an active USEF membership will need an EC license to attend the event. A free EC membership can be issued using your active USEF number at, www.equestrian.ca . EC's safe sport must be completed, once Safe Sport has been completed it is good for a 3 year period. www.equestrian.ca
- 7. Amateur Status designation on an EC Competitive License (or Amateur card with USEF membership) is required for individuals wishing to exhibit in Amateur classes. You must apply for this card at the same time you apply for the Competitive License. Refer to EC General Regulations and Breed specific rules on Amateur Status to determine eligibility.

Visit **www.equestrian.ca** to obtain a bronze sport license information. Bronze license is the minimum required for Spring Fling, these <u>cannot</u> be purchased at the show.

- 8. For all EC Sport Licenses to be valid, a current membership in the Alberta Equestrian Federation (or other Provincial Sport Organization PSO) is required. AEF membership and information can be obtained at www.albertaequestrian.com
- 9. AEF Memberships are required for all Leadline as stated by Alberta Equine Federation. EC sport memberships are not required for leadline.

Leadline Riders have a two options for memberships.

- 1. Purchase an annual AEF membership via website OR
- 2. Fill out free membership form, available at www.springflingshow.ca. must completed and submitted to AEF prior to show and during AEF business hours. Must be completed prior to ALL shows.

ARENA

Arena times are as follows: Thursday: 1pm-8pm Friday: 6:30am – last class Saturday: 6:30am – last class

Sunday: 6:30am - to end of classes

Arena will also be open for working horses at the lunch and supper breaks.

Should you wish to purchase extra time in the arena you need to purchase the time on your entry form. This will allow us time

to advise the facility staff. If you wish to share the cost, one person shall list it on their entries and that person is responsible for collecting from others. Cost is \$160 plus GST per hour.

- 2. Post entries will be accepted at no additional charge for horses already entered in the show. \$30.00 late fee for horses not entered prior to closing, plus class fees. Entries postmarked after closing shall be considered post entries and may not appear in the show program.
- **3.** Should you require an account to charge <u>ONLY</u> shavings, RV spots, or tack stalls fill out an entry form with your name and barn with what you need. The show office will provide you with a separate account from any class and horse fees.

"TBA/Buy a Class" classes offered for purchase at this show and will be "sold" on a first come first serve basis. TBA fee to be charged to the exhibitor requesting the class plus the class fee, all other entrants pay just the class fee. The Show Committee reserves the right to approve the class proposed for purchase.

- 5. An office fee of \$40 per horse will be charged for all entries.
- 6. As of January 1, 1991, all sanctioned AHA shows must collect a mandatory fee per horse entered per show. This is in accordance to the 1990 convention resolution #9/90 that addressed mandatory funding for the new Judges, Commission and Education/Evaluation Committee. To compensate for the US exchange rate, the Spring Fling Horse Show will be charging \$7.00 CAD to those entering horses in Arabian or Half Arabian classes to cover this fee.
- 7. The Spring Fling Society is required to collect the

AHA Show Recognition Fees which are (\$7USD + \$3) \$10.00 CAD per horse for Arabians and Half Arabian entries. This fee is payable per horse per show.

- 8. No entry fee will be refunded except on receipt of a Veterinarian's Certificate. The Veterinarian's Certificate shall be presented to the Show Secretary before refund is granted and must be presented before the Thursday prior to the start of the show. The office fee and stall fees will be retained by Spring Fling, with all other fees returned to the horse owner. There is no substitution of horses for any reason.
- 9. Every horse on the grounds must be entered in at least one class. If class is scratched for any reason the class fee will not be refunded.
- 10. A charge of \$50 will be levied for cheques returned by the bank for any reason. Exhibitors with returned cheques will not be allowed to show unless a certified cheque, cash or money order is presented to the Show Secretary.
- 11. Every horse shall be assigned a number. This **number must be worn and visible at all times** in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. Any exhibitor using the wrong number, or having no number in the ring may be excused from the class or may be disqualified in the event of a protest. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that they are wearing the correct number in the class.
- 12. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- 13. The Show Committee reserves the right to reject any entry at any time for any reason the Officials deem reasonable cause.
- 14. The Show Committee reserves the right to combine or cancel classes having fewer than 3 entries at closing of entries. Exhibitors will be notified if classes cancelled due to low entries. All changes will be posted at the Show Office. Please ensure your classes appear in the show program as entered.
- 15. In order to enter a <u>BREED SPECIFIC STAKE</u> class, a horse (or rider in the case of equitation) must have competed in at least one class in the same division at this show.
- 16. In order to enter into the <u>ALL BREED CHAMPIONSHIP</u> <u>JACKPOT</u> class a horse (or rider in the case of equitation) must have competed in at least 2 classes in the same division at this show.
- 17. Hors concurs allowed. These entries must pay the same entry fee and are subject to the same conditions that apply to regular entries as outlined in the division rules. Hors concurs entries are not eligible for any awards. Please notify steward.
- 18. Substitution of rider can be made if done prior to start of session. **No** substitution of horses allowed.
- 19. All entries must be made on the official entry form (photocopy as needed) and be properly signed by the

owner or authorized agent. All Junior competitor entries must be signed by a parent or legal guardian.

ALL ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

- One owner per entry form
- Full address of owner
- Signature of owner
- Coaches Name or Self Declared
- Copies of all membership cards; this includes AHA, CMHA, ASHAC, EC, ASHA of Alberta, NWSA (as applicable to breed/division shown)
 - Amateur Owner and Junior Exhibitor cards
 - Copy of each horse's registration papers

(front and back; showing current ownership)

- Entry fees including stabling, office fees, drug fees, AHA fees
 - Horse Vaccinations Papers see Rules and Regulations

PRIZES

- All Regular Halter, Performance, Reining and Breed Specific Stake classes will receive ribbons to fifth place. No cash or prizes will be awarded.
- 2. Junior Exhibitor Classes receive ribbons to fifth place.
- All Breed Championship Jackpot Classes take ribbons to fifth place,
 - 1st place \$500.00
 - 2nd place \$300.00
 - 3rd place \$200.00
- 50/50 Class half of money collected from entries split between winners, ribbons to fifth place.
- All cheques and Awards will be given after class results submitted to show secretary.

STABLING

Stalls are assigned on a first come basis, with changes made as necessary to facilitate the smooth running of the show. There will be a charge of \$140 for Stall/Tack rooms for the 3 days of the show. No haul ins permitted.

- Horses must be out of box stalls by 11:00 pm on move out day to avoid being charged for additional nights
- 2. First bedding (consisting of 1-4 cuft bag of shavings) will be supplied for every stall booked (tack rooms included). Additional bags can be purchased from Spring Fling at the show, a schedule will be posted at Kim Seward Training Stalls. Book your initial shavings order on your entry form so they will be available upon arrival at the show.
- 3. No pellet shavings are permitted in the barn.
- 4. Exhibitors will be allowed to move into the barns after 9:00am on Thursday, April 25, 2024. If an earlier check-in time is required phone Kerri Buksa to make arrangements, 780 720 6567. There will be a fee charged for early stabling which cannot take place until after 4pm on Wednesday.
- 5. Wash racks are available.

- 6. Exhibitors shall not move from their assigned stalls or trade without permission of the Show Manager. Violation of this rule will result in the removal of the proposed competitor from the Show without refund of any kind. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 7. Stabling is only guaranteed to those who submit their stabling requirements with their Entry Forms before the Entry Deadline. Do not assume that you will be able to obtain stalls if you arrive at the Show and have not entered prior to the Entry Deadline. Those who have booked stall but wish to add stalls after the Entry deadline are not guaranteed that additional stalls will be in the same area of the stalls that were initially requested and assigned.
- 8. All ready rooms, tack rooms and dressing rooms must be free of garbage, zip ties, hair pins and any other debris. Should this not be followed there will be a \$50 charge per stall due upon receipt of invoice.
- 9. Facility lights in barn must be off no later than midnight to allow all horse time to rest.

R.V. HOOK-UPS AND PARKING -

There are RV power hook-ups available at the barn area in addition to a full-service Campground adjacent to the show grounds at Ponoka. RV power hook-ups for the barn area are limited and only available on a first come first serve basis. These RV spaces need to be booked on the appropriate space on the entry form. Non-powered sites are available as well at no charge.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. All Breed classes will follow EC General Performance Rules. SaddleSeat Equitation to follow section B.
- 2. For the Arabian Division, Junior Horses are 5 years and under as of January 1 of the current year. for Morgan and American Saddlebreds, Junior Horses are 4 years and under as of January 1, of the current year. Other breeds as per their regulations.
- AHA and EC rules state individuals are considered Juniors until their 19th birthday prior to December 1 of the previous calendar year. For Breed specific classes the rules of that Breed shall be used.
- **4.** Arabian Country English Pleasure may not enter Arabian English Pleasure or Arabian Pleasure Driving classes at this show. All horses are eligible to enter the All Breeds English Pleasure classes.
- **5.** Participants in Morgan English Pleasure classes MUST wear saddleseat attire.
- **6.** Morgan Classic Pleasure horses <u>may cross enter</u> in all other Morgan English Pleasure and Pleasure Driving classes offered at this show.
- **7.** Amateur designation means Adults only, unless otherwise specified.

- 8. Participants in All Breeds English Pleasure
 MUST wear saddleseat attire. All horses are eligible
 to enter the All Breeds English Pleasure classes including
 those horses already entered in Arabian and HalfArabian/Anglo-Arabian English Pleasure and Country English
 Pleasure horses; Morgan English Pleasure and Classic
 Pleasure horses; American Saddlebred Park, Three-Gaited
 Pleasure and Country Pleasure horses; and to horses of other
 breeds that have an English Pleasure division that exhibits in
 Saddleseat Attire. Horses entered must conform to their
 respective breed specifications for shoeing and horse age
 designations (including Junior horses as per breed
 specifications). Horses must walk, trot and canter both ways of
 the ring.
- 9. In All Breeds Western Pleasure classes, horses must conform to their respective breed specifications for shoeing and horse age designation (including Junior horses as per breed specifications). Horses must work both ways of the ring at all three gaits. At the option of the judge, horses may be asked to extend the walk, jog or lope, one or both ways of the ring. No more than 12 may be asked to extend the lope.
- 10. Ranch Horse Rail Pleasure class measures the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a means of conveyance from one ranch task to another and should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse should be well-broke, relaxed, quiet, soft, and cadence at all gaits. The horse should be ridden on a relatively loose rein with light contact and without requiring undue restraint. The horse should be soft in the bridle and yield to contact. The ideal ranch rail pleasure horse should have natural head carriage at each gait. In all gaits, movement of the ranch rail pleasure should simulate a horse needing to cover long distances, softly and guietly, like that of a working ranch horse. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward, working speed while under control by the rider. Light contact should be rewarded, and horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing the maneuver requirements and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations.
- 11. In All Breeds Hunter Pleasure classes, horses must conform to their respective breed specifications for shoeing and horse age designation (including Junior horses as per breed specifications). Horses are to be shown at a flat-footed walk, normal trot and easy canter, not to gallop.
- **12. All Breeds Equitation** classes will be conducted according to EC Section F General Performance pertaining to Western Horsemanship, Hunter Seat on the Flat, Saddleseat Equitation shall use book B.
- **13.** AHA Medal Class Specifications: Refer to the Arabian Division, Equitation Section of the EC Rule Book (Chapter 36 of the Breeds Rules see B3608 along with Class Specifications in B3607 and B3608).
- **14.** The following Miscellaneous and Local classes are not rated for EC awards:
 - All classes within the Walk-Trot division
- All Breeds English Country Pleasure Open (horses eligible for these classes are those who qualify to show in the

- Country (ASB / Arabian/ Half Arabian or Classic Pleasure Division (Morgan) within their breed specifications
- 15. All Breed Walk-Trot/Jog must enter ring at a walk.
- **16.** In **Performance Halter** all horses 3 and over must have entered and shown in a performance class at the same show. No whips or other attention getters are allowed. Horses will be presented in a relaxed and dignified manner. Horses should be positioned with their weight squarely on their feet, not stretched. All rules are in Handbook subchapter AR-1, AR-2, AR-3, AR-4 for further detailed rules.
- **17.** Junior exhibitors may not show stallions in All Breed classes. For breed-specific classes the rules of each breed organization shall apply with respect to Junior competitors exhibiting stallions.
- **18.** Two Minute Gate. In collective classes, the gate will close two minutes after the first horse enters the ring or in cases with large classes taking more than two minutes after the entry of the final horse in a continuous string of horses.
- **19. Schooling Classes -** Not to be judged. May use training tack and regular riding clothes. Must have a back number on to enter into the ring. There will be an announcer to make calls but everyone may school as they please as long as they are riding in a safe and mannerly fashion. It will run like a normal class without being judged.
- **20. 50/50** 2 riders enter class for 1 fee of \$50. 1 rider goes the first direction and then the 2nd rider goes the other. Which ever combination wins the class gets 50% of the money from the class. Discipline appropriate dress is not required, it is strongly recommended that your Team have distinguishing outfits to identify you are a Team.
- Eg. 10 horses enter \$250 goes to the wining team and \$250 goes to the show.
- 21. Academy Classes To show at a Walk/Trot. Full show clothes are not required. Safe, clean, tidy, clothes are acceptable. This class is for people who are new to the industry and want to experience a show but may not have the tack, show clothes or experience for a regular class. No points awarded. Horse may cross enter but rider cannot. Riders must be AEF members.
- **22.** Leadline Class riders must be AEF members, see Memberships and Registration for option on membership. Riders must wear helmuts, feet in stirrups, saddle to fit child, lead to be attached to a halter over bridle.
- 23. Walk/Trot Classes If entry numbers exceed 10 entries, the class will be split into two separately judged classes, A and a B. Classes will be split at the discretion of the Show Management and will be posted well in advance of the class to provide notice to exhibitors.
- **24.** All Breed, All Discipline, Adult Only, Sit up & Ride Championship Jackpot Class Riders will complete rail work together and then the Judge will assign a series of manoeuvres for the riders to complete individually.
